

#### PrairieLearn: Test Creation [July 2025]


Please follow these instructions to create a test in PrairieLearn using unique question identifiers [Question Identifier (QID)] to link questions already developed in the system.

### Creating a New Test


First, sign into <u>PrairieLearn</u>, open your course page, and then select your course.




 Select the course instance where you would like to create the test, making sure that the access dates are set correctly.




Click the "Assessments" tab on the lower left of the screen, then "+ Add assessment"




Next, create a title and a unique assessment identifier. The Assessment Identifier (AID) should be unique and recognizable for future use. The AID must have no spaces and only use letters, numbers, dashes, and underscores (e.g. "MOD2-business-principles" or "WPP\_AY25-26"). Choose "Exam" for both the Type & the Set, and then click create.



 Then, click the "Files" tab at the top of the screen, and select the "Edit" button next to the "infoAssessment.json" file.




To create the assessment, we need to add information inside the brackets of two sections. "zones": [] sets the permissions that connect the questions to the test and "allowAccess": [] sets the permissions that allow students to access the test such as connecting the test to the CBTF through PrairieTest.




### **Zone Settings**

"zones": []: Groups of questions within the test. Students will see questions in a randomized order within each zone, but the zones always appear in the same order, and questions are not randomized across zones. Detailed information about zones can be found here in the PrairieLearn documentation.




Helpful Tip: It is important to separate multiple questions with a comma after the bracket. { "id": "firstQuestion", "autoPoints": [5, 3, 1, 0.5, 0.25] },


In the next example, a second zone has been added to the test. (Note: the comma that has been placed after the zone 1 bracket to separate it from the second zone). This zone will randomly choose a set number of manually graded questions from the list of "alternatives".




- First, organize the unique question identifiers [Question Identifier (QID)] into the desired question zones.
- Then, connect the questions to the assessment by adding the following code inside the brackets to the right of "zones": []. Then click, "Save and sync" to add the question.



 Click the "+ Add course instance" tab to create the course for the WWP. Create a long and short name for this course instance and then click create. Leave the "Make course instance available to students unchecked for now.




Click the "Questions" tab, and then "+ Add question".



Starting from an empty question, create a title and a unique identifier for your question. The
 Question Identifier (QID) should be unique and recognizable to aid in assessment creation.
 The QID must have no spaces and only use letters, numbers, dashes, and underscores (e.g.

"MC-business-principles" or "WPP-website"). Then, press the "Create" button.







Then click "Save and sync"

 Then, click the "Preview" tab to view the question.







## Setting up & Editing the Test

After creating the necessary, the test can be created to link to the testing center.


o Click the "Assessments" tab on the lower left of the screen, then "+ Add assessment"




Next, create a title and a unique assessment identifier. The Assessment Identifier (AID) should be unique and recognizable for future use. The AID must have no spaces and only use letters, numbers, dashes, and underscores (e.g. "MOD2-business-principles" or "WPP\_AY25-26"). Choose "Exam" for both the Type & the Set, and then click create.



Then, click the "Files" tab at the top of the screen, and select the "Edit" button.



First, connect the question to the assessment by adding the following code inside the brackets to the right of "zones": []. Then click, "Save and sync" to add the question.




In a new browser tab, go to your course's page on <u>PrairieTest</u>.




o Then from the Exam page, click the lick to the "UC San Diego Writing Placement Process".




Next, click on the "Exam Settings" tab.





In the PrairieLearn access section, click the copy button to the right of the box of code.




 Now go back to <u>PrairieLearn</u> and paste the code into the "allowAccess": [] of the assessment. Then click "Save and sync" to connect assessment to <u>PrairieTest</u>.







Verify that the Test is linked to the center by revisiting <u>PrairieTest</u> and refreshing the "Exam Settings" page, in the PrairieLearn assessments section.



## **Common Issues & Tips for Success**

Small changes in the coding elements can cause issues and errors. Here are some common mistakes and tips for success.

o If you mistakenly delete a part of a code, a red X icon will appear next to the line where the issue is. Hovering over the icon will provide information regarding the issue. In this example, I deleted the ">" character from the end of line 12. Because part of the closing tag is missing, the system is reading the error in line 13. Replacing the missing character will fix the problem.

Sometimes adding additional spaces or line breaks where you need to make changes can help visualize the different pieces of the code and help prevent accidental deletion of coding elements. For this example, I started a new line for each piece of information I modified for this question; this has no effect on the formatting or display of the student view of the question.
